### What's Happening in Religious Education

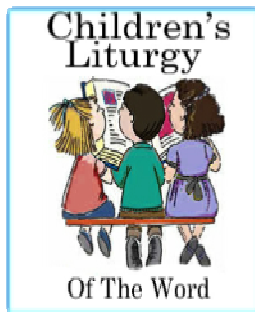
Sunday morning classes are held in the School classrooms for preschool-K, 8:30-9:30 AM and 1st-5th grade, 9:45 to 10:45 AM.

# Creating a Culture of Encounter National Migration Week 2017

January 8-14, 2017

For nearly a half century, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated National Migration Week, which is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children and victims and survivors of human trafficking.

The theme for **National Migration Week 2017** draws attention to Pope Francis' call to create a culture of encounter, and in doing so, to look beyond our own needs and wants to those of others around us. In the homily given at his first Pentecost as pope, he emphasized the importance of encounter in the Christian faith: "For me this word is very important. Encounter with others. Why? Because faith is an encounter with Jesus and we must do what Jesus does: encounter others." With respect to migrants, too

often in our cotemporary culture we fail to encounter them as persons, and instead look at them as others or render them invisible. We do not take the time to engage migrants in a meaningful way, as fellow children of God, but remain aloof to their presence and suspicious of their intentions.

During this National Migration Week, let us all take the opportunity to engage migrants as community members and neighbors - all of whom are worthy of our attention and support.

Be watching for the following: A mass for immigrants in our community, hosting a multicultural potluck event, to promote cultural awareness and foster a community of welcome and we will take action on the Justice for Immigrants. ## LITURGY

### BLESSING AT THE ENTRANCE OF YOUR HOUSE ON EPIPHANY

We invite you to adopt this custom in your family. The family gathers to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above the home's entrance,

20 + C + M + B + 17

The letters C, M and B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus Mansionem benedict*, "May Christ bless the hours." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2017 is the year.

Instructions for Blessing the Home

Using the chalk, mark the lintel of your front door (or front porch step) as follows:

20 + C + B + 17 while saying:

The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and sixteen years

ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the New Year. Amen.

Then offer the following prayer:

Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen

"Chalking the door" is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home. With time the chalk will fade. As it does we let the meaning of the symbols written sink into the depths of our heart and be manifest in our words and actions the Latin words, "*Christus mansionem benedictat*, May Christ bless the house."

# HISPANIC MINISTRY

Bendición en la entrada de tu casa en Epifanía. Le invitamos a adoptar esta costumbre en su familia. La familia se reúne para pedir la bendición de Dios en su hogar y en los que viven o visitan la casa. Es una invitación para que Jesús sea un huésped cotidiano en nuestro hogar, nuestras idas y venidas, nuestras conversaciones, nuestro trabajo y juego, nuestras alegrías y tristezas.

Una manera tradicional de hacer esto es usar la tiza para escribir encima de la entrada de la casa, 20 + C + M + B + 17. Las letras C, M, B tienen dos significados. Son las iniciales de los nombres tradicionales de los tres magos: Caspar, Melchior y Balthazar. También abrevian las palabras latinas *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "Que Cristo bendiga la casa". Los signos "+" representan la cruz y 2017 es el año.

Instrucciones para la bendición de la casa

Usando la tiza marque el dintel de su puerta delantera (o paso del porche delantero) como sigue: 20 + C + M + B + 17 al decir:

Los tres Reyes Magos, Caspar, Melchor y Balthazar siguieron a la estrella del Hijo de Dios que se hizo humano hace dos mil dieciséis años. Que

Cristo bendiga nuestro hogar y permanezca con nosotros durante el Año Nuevo. Amén.

Luego ofrezca la siguiente oración: Visita, oh bendito Señor, esta casa con la alegría de tu presencia. Bendice a todos los que viven o visiten

aquí con el don de su amor; Y concédenos que podamos manifestar vuestro amor el uno al otro ya todas las vidas a quienes tocamos. Que crezcamos en la gracia, en el conocimiento y en el

amor de vosotros; Guía, consola, y fortalece en paz, oh Jesucristo, ahora y por los siglos. Amén

"Golpear la puerta" es una manera de celebrar y literalmente marcar la ocasión de la Epifanía y la bendición de Dios de nuestras vidas y nuestro

hogar. Con el tiempo la tiza se desvanecerá. Dejando que el significado de los símbolos escritos se hundan en las profundidades de nuestro corazón y se manifiesten en nuestras palabras y acciones las palabras latinas *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "Que Cristo bendiga la casa".

## b) Busque un abogado de inmigración

Busque un abogado de inmigración especializado en casos de deportación que pudiera representarlo si lo detienen. Memorice el nombre y número de su abogado de inmigración. ## c) Si no tiene documentos...

No conteste a ninguna pregunta, o diga solamente "necesito hablar con mi abogado". Si Ud. tiene documentos de inmigración que están válidos, muéstrelos. Siempre llévelos con Ud. No diga nada acerca de donde nació o como entró a los Estados Unidos. No lleve consigo papeles de otro país. (Si lo hace, el gobierno puede usar esta información en un proceso de deportación). Muéstreles la tarjeta de "¡Conozca sus derechos!" que acompaña a este folleto. ¡Sobretudo, no muestre documentos falsos y no mienta!
