I have worked with a committee of four principals to prepare the attached Religion Curriculum. This K-8 format has been approved by Archbishop Vlazny. It is structured similar to the other curriculum guidelines, and based on the four pillars of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

The curriculum is designed as an over-arching umbrella that sets forth student learning expectation for grades K-8. Some content areas may not be covered by each textbook at a given level, but each of the doctrinal emphases should be covered during the course of the 9 year program. When you make your selection of textbooks, you can review them to find where the content is covered.

Attached to each grade level are prayers and teachings for that grade level. The students should be expected to know these prayers and teachings. At the end of the total curriculum, there is a glossary of terms for each grade. This is a ready reference for you. There is some duplication from grade to grade but we received permission from RCL Benziger to download their glossary and did not want to make changes or edits.

Also attached is the list of approved textbooks, publishers and representatives.

# GRADE ONE

## DOCTRINAL EMPHASIS

- ◆ *God the Creator gives us life and grace and promises us eternal life through Jesus.*

### CREED

- ◆ God created the human person in His own image and likeness and every life is sacred.
- ◆ God created us to know, love and serve Him and to be happy with Him forever in heaven.
- ◆ There is only one true God and in God there are three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit (the Trinity).
- ◆ Jesus is the Son of God and is both human and divine.
- ◆ Jesus suffered and died for us and rose from the dead.
- ◆ Sacraments manifest God's presence.

### SCRIPTURE

- ◆ Jesus is the Son of God who tells us about our Father and the Holy Spirit.
- ◆ Scripture tells us about Jesus' life as examples of how we should live our life.
- ◆ In the Bible Jesus shows God's love by teaching and healing people. He teaches us to pray and love God and others.

### PRAYER AND WORSHIP

- ◆ Prayer is listening and talking to God. Jesus teaches us how to pray.
- ◆ The liturgical seasons help us to live a life of prayer. (Advent, Christmas, Lent , Easter).
- ◆ Sacraments are signs of God's life (grace) which we celebrate within the Church.
- ◆ We talk each day with God our Father to express our love, to give thanks, to ask for forgiveness and to ask for help in our need.
- ◆ The Mass is a very special celebration for God's people. We listen to God's Word in the Scripture Readings and pray as a family.

### CHRISTIAN LIVING

- ◆ At Mass we gather together to worship God and listen to His word.
- ◆ The world is God's gift to us. We take care of all God's creation—the people, animals, earth, and air around us.
- ◆ Jesus shows us how to love through prayer and service to others.

## GRADE 1

*Students should be familiar with and able to recite the prayers of this grade level as well as those from Kindergarten.*

### OUR FATHER

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name;  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread;  
and forgive us our trespasses  
as we forgive those who trespass against us;  
and lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil. *Amen.*

### PRAYER BEFORE MEALS

Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts  
which we are about to receive  
from your goodness.  
Through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

### PRAYER AFTER MEALS

We give you thanks, almighty God,  
For these and all the gifts  
we have received from your goodness.  
Through Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

# GRADE TWO

## DOCTRINAL EMPHASIS

- ◆ *Jesus nourishes and strengthens God's life of grace within us through the Sacraments and Mass.*

### CREED

- ◆ Through Baptism we are given new life, taken into God's family and become members of His Church.
- ◆ Jesus suffered and died for us on the cross, rose from the dead and gave us the gift of His own Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist.
- ◆ Jesus returned to his Father in heaven and sent the Holy Spirit to be with us always.

### SCRIPTURE

- ◆ From the scriptures we learn about the Sacrament of Baptism, Forgiveness (Reconciliation), and Eucharist.
- ◆ The Mass is the celebration of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.
- ◆ Sacraments, outward signs of God's love, are rooted in scripture.

### PRAYER AND WORSHIP

- ◆ The Mass is a celebration of the Holy Eucharist.
- ◆ We receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation which gives us grace and forgives our sins.
- ◆ We receive the Sacrament of Eucharist which is the Body and Blood of Christ.
- ◆ The Church celebrates the liturgical year: Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Pentecost and Ordinary time.

### CHRISTIAN LIVING

- ◆ When we celebrate the Sacrament of the Eucharist with our parish or school community, we remember the special meal Jesus shared at the Last Supper.
- ◆ Jesus prayed to God his Father. Jesus teaches us to pray as He did.
- ◆ Jesus taught us to love others. We love and respect others and God's creation.

## GRADE 2

*Students should be familiar with and able to recite the prayers of this grade level as well as those from Kindergarten – Grade 1.*

### ACT OF CONTRITION

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.  
In choosing to do wrong and failing to  
do good,  
I have sinned against you, whom I should  
love above all things.  
I firmly intend, with your help to do penance,  
to sin no more,  
and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.  
Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died  
for us.  
In his name, my God, have mercy.

- ✘ I am the Lord your God, You shall not have strange gods before me.

# GRADE THREE

## DOCTRINAL EMPHASIS

- ◆ *Jesus continues his life and work through His Church.*

### CREED

- ◆ The church was founded by Jesus when He sent the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.
  - ✦ The Church is ONE – united in its belief in Jesus Christ, the sacraments of grace and commitment to service.
  - ✦ The Church is HOLY – based on the teachings of Jesus Christ as found in the Gospels.
  - ✦ The Church is CATHOLIC – open to all people.
  - ✦ The Church is APOSTOLIC – faithful to the teachings of the Apostles in spreading the faith of Jesus Christ.

### SCRIPTURE

- ◆ The Bible is the story of God’s love for us which teaches us to live as God’s people, the Church.
- ◆ Teachings of the Gospels develop the idea of holiness in the Church and for individuals.
- ◆ The Church is committed to being faithful to the teachings of Jesus and the Apostles.

### PRAYER AND WORSHIP

- ◆ Through the Sacraments we share God’s life and love in the community of the Church.
- ◆ We learn the different kinds of prayer: adoration, thanksgiving, forgiveness and asking.
- ◆ We learn the creed which is a statement of our Church’s common beliefs.
- ◆ We honor the Blessed Virgin Mary who holds a special place in the Church as Mother of God and the greatest of all the disciples of Jesus.

### CHRISTIAN LIVING

- ◆ Jesus shares his mission with his disciples. We live out the Good News of Jesus as members of the Church by working for justice and peace.
- ◆ Jesus calls his followers to be united. The Church works for Christian unity.
- ◆ We belong to the Communion of Saints. God calls us to be saints.

## GRADE 3

*Students should be familiar with and able to recite the prayers of this grade level as well as those from Kindergarten – Grade 2.*

### APOSTLES CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
Creator of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died  
and was buried;  
he descended into hell;  
on the third day he rose again from the dead.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at  
the right hand of God the Father almighty;  
from there he will come to judge the living  
and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and life everlasting. *Amen.*

### PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful.

# GRADE FOUR

## DOCTRINAL EMPHASIS

- ◆ *Christians are called to live as Jesus did by choosing a life of love characterized by the foundation of Christian morality presented in the Old and New Testaments.*

### CREED

- ◆ Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promise of salvation.
- ◆ Jesus is the Son of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity – fully divine and fully human.
- ◆ The Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes show us how to lead a moral life.
- ◆ Jesus gave us a new law of Love.

### SCRIPTURE

- ◆ The New Testament tells us about the life of Jesus.
- ◆ The words and life of Jesus contained in the scriptures teach us to lead a moral life.
- ◆ Scriptures tell us that Jesus is fully God and fully human.

### PRAYER AND WORSHIP

- ◆ Jesus calls us to a life of conversion.
- ◆ We pray to the Holy Spirit to help and guide us in time of temptation.
- ◆ We examine our conscience regularly in order to make our lives better and to grow in virtue.
- ◆ We grow in our understanding of the theological and cardinal virtues through prayer, reflection and practice of them in our life.
- ◆ Personal prayer is essential to know Jesus and to grow in holiness as His disciples.

### CHRISTIAN LIVING

- ◆ God wants us to love and respect others. We show our love for God by practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.
- ◆ The Church is a worldwide community. We have responsibilities as members of the Church to celebrate the sacraments and take an active role in the Church community.
- ◆ We are called to act with peace and justice. We respect the gift of life by living the Beatitudes.

# PRAYERS AND TEACHINGS

## GRADE 4

*Students should be familiar with and able to recite the prayers of this grade level as well as those from Kindergarten – Grade 3.*

### **THEOLOGICAL VIRTUES: FAITH, HOPE AND LOVE**

#### **ACT OF FAITH**

O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God  
in three divine Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.  
I believe that your divine Son became man and died for our sins,  
and that he will come to judge the living and the dead. *Amen.*

#### **ACT OF HOPE**

O My God, relying on your infinite goodness and promises,  
I hope to obtain pardon of my sins,  
the help of your grace and life everlasting,  
through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord. *Amen.*

#### **ACT OF LOVE**

O my God, I love you above all things with my whole heart and soul,  
because you are all good and worthy of all my love.  
I love my neighbor as myself for the love of you.  
I forgive all who have injured me,  
and ask pardon of all whom I have injured. *Amen.*

# PRAYERS AND TEACHINGS

## GRADE 4 (CONTINUED)

*Students should be familiar with and able to recite the prayers of this grade level as well as those from Kindergarten – Grade 3.*

### **PRAYER OF SAINT FRANCIS**

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace;  
Where there is hatred let me sow your love,  
Where there is injury, pardon,  
Where there is doubt, faith;  
Where there is despair, hope;  
Where there is darkness, light;  
Where there is sadness, joy.  
O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek  
  
To be consoled, as to console,  
To be understood as to understand,  
To be loved as to love.  
For it is in giving that we receive,  
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned,  
It is in dying that we are born to eternal life. *Amen.*

### **THE ROSARY**

*Review the prayers that are used in the Rosary and teach the students how to pray using the rosary beads.*

### **THE MEMORARE**

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary,  
that never was it known,  
that anyone who fled to your protection,  
implored your help, or sought your intercession,  
was left unaided.  
To you we come, before you we stand, sinful and  
sorrowful.  
O Mother of the Word incarnate, despise not my  
petitions, but hear and answer me. *Amen.*



# GRADE FIVE

## DOCTRINAL EMPHASIS

- ◆ *We are called to live a Sacramental life.*

### CREED

- ◆ The Sacraments are signs by which Jesus shares God's life and grace with us.
- ◆ The Sacraments of initiation are Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.
- ◆ In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God's forgiveness is offered to all who seek it.
- ◆ The Holy Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ and is the heart of our Catholic faith.

### SCRIPTURE

- ◆ The celebration of the Sacraments is grounded in Sacred Scripture.
- ◆ The seven sacraments are powerful signs and rituals given by Christ to the Church to give grace.
- ◆ The Paschal Mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection shows us a way to new life.

### PRAYER AND WORSHIP

- ◆ We reverence the signs, symbols and sacramentals of our faith.
- ◆ Each Sacrament is a special source of grace with a special purpose in our life.
- ◆ There are various forms of prayer that help us deepen our love for God and for others.
- ◆ The prayer of the Church community nourishes the life of each member and the life of the community itself.

### CHRISTIAN LIVING

- ◆ Jesus calls us to serve him in the priesthood of the faithful. To share in the mission of bringing the Good News of Christ to the world.
- ◆ Marriage is part of God's plan and its covenant is built on Christ's love for the Church.
- ◆ Holy Orders is the sacrament through which the Church continues the Apostles' mission.

## GRADE 5

*Students should be familiar with and able to recite the prayers of this grade level as well as those from Kindergarten – Grade 4.*

### **CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY:**

*Actions that help people in their bodily needs.*

- Feed people who are hungry.
- Give drink to the people who are thirsty.
- Clothe the people who need clothes.
- Visit prisoners.
- Shelter the homeless.
- Visit the people who are sick.
- Bury the people who have died. *Amen.*

### **GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT:**

**Wisdom:** The knowledge and ability to recognize and follow God's will in our lives.

**Understanding:** The ability to love others as Jesus calls us to do.

**Counsel (Right Judgment):** The ability to make right choices.

**Fortitude (Courage):** The strength to give witness to our faith.

**Knowledge:** The ability to learn more about God and his plan, leading us to wisdom and understanding.

**Piety (Reverence):** A love and respect for all that God has created.

**Fear of the Lord (Wonder and Awe):**  
A recognition that God's Presence and Love fills all creation.

### **SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY:**

*Actions that help people in their spiritual needs.*

- Help the people who sin.
- Teach people who are ignorant.
- Give advice to people who have doubts.
- Comfort people who suffer.
- Be patient with other people.
- Forgive people who hurt you.
- Pray for those who are alive and those who have died. *Amen.*

# GRADE SIX

## DOCTRINAL EMPHASIS

- ◆ *God's plan is revealed through Salvation History.*

### CREED

- ◆ The Bible is the revealed Word of God
- ◆ The Biblical narratives tell the story of Salvation History.
- ◆ The Scriptures found in the Old Testament contain the roots of our faith and are basic to both Christianity and Judaism
- ◆ The central, saving event of the Old Testament is the Exodus, when God established a covenant with the Chosen People, the Israelites

### SCRIPTURE

- ◆ Stories of the early leaders of the Old Testament reveal God's relationship and interaction with his chosen people.
- ◆ Our relationship with God is based on a covenant that began with the Israelites and was revealed in its fullness in Jesus Christ.
- ◆ Jesus' life and teachings are connected to God's promises in the Old Testament.

### PRAYER AND WORSHIP

- ◆ The Psalms are prayers Jesus prayed while on earth and remain an important part of our Catholic worship today.
- ◆ We prayerfully reflect on passages from the Bible.
- ◆ We use Sacred Scripture as a regular source for study and prayer in order to grow in an understanding of ourselves and of God's loving will in our regard.
- ◆ We turn to God in prayer each day and ask for His strength to carry out His will.

### CHRISTIAN LIVING

- ◆ The Bible is an important source for Christian living and worship.
- ◆ God makes himself known in his Son. Many people heard Jesus' message and became disciples. Jesus taught about living and growing closer to God.
- ◆ We are called to be faithful to God's covenant by the holy men and women in the Salvation History.

# GRADE SEVEN & EIGHT

## THEMATIC CURRICULUM

*The Curriculum Framework for teaching Religion for young adolescents in Grades 7 and 8 is designed to cover a two-year period and offers a number of options as noted below:*

1. Most of the programs designed for junior high school students are broadly thematic in scope. This, of course, introduces a great deal of rich diversity into the junior high school religion program. However this breadth of diversity also defies fitting seventh and eighth grades into a curricular framework that highlights one specific theme for each grade level as seen in Grades K-6. Aware of this problem, publishers have made efforts to correlate their material to both the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* and to **Scripture**. Ultimately, nothing is lost while much is gained in this new approach to choosing curriculum options offered at the junior high level.
2. Schools using an Archdiocesan approved religion textbook series K-8 (such as Sadlier's *We Believe*, RCL's *Blest Are We*, or Loyola's *Christ Our Life*) may choose to remain with that specific series for teaching religion to their seventh and eighth grade students;
3. Schools using an Archdiocesan approved religion textbook series K-8 may opt to teach the series only through sixth grade and then choose to select a new series for teaching junior high students in Grades 7 and 8. Any of the texts on the "Approved Religion Programs" list may be selected for this purpose. Be aware that some texts are designed to cover a full year of work, some are intended for a half a school year and require another text selection for the latter half of the year, and some are designed for a quarter year of teaching and require selection of four texts per grade in total. You are free also to "mix and match" texts from different Archdiocesan approved publishers listed for junior high students. Most texts are written in such a manner that they may be used at either the seventh or eighth grade level.

# GRADE SEVEN

## DOCTRINAL EMPHASIS

- ◆ *Our faith calls us to listen, understand and act on the message of Jesus as revealed in the New Testament.*

- ◆ The Paschal Mystery relates the Passover, Exodus, and Old Covenant to the New Covenant Jesus made in His death and resurrection.

### PRAYER AND WORSHIP

- ◆ The Sacraments are community celebrations that call us to share God’s love with others.
- ◆ The Mass is the re-enactment of the Last Supper. The Bread and Wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus which we receive in the Eucharist.
- ◆ Ritual is an important part of worship: processions, prayer forms of the various seasons of the liturgical year.

### CHRISTIAN LIVING

- ◆ Jesus teaches us through word and actions to work for peace and justice in our world.
- ◆ We are called to a life-time of living out the Christian Principles of peace and justice.
- ◆ The Beatitudes are a summary of Christian morality.
- ◆ The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy are guidelines given to us by the Church to help us live a good life.
- ◆ There are modern day disciples who can be models for us – who are the modern day saints?

# GRADE EIGHT

## DOCTRINAL EMPHASIS

- ◆ *Our faith calls us to examine and appreciate Church History so that we may further the Kingdom of God.*

### CREED

<b>MEDITATION</b>	Meditation is a type of prayer in which we are silent and concentrate on listening to God through our feelings, imagination, and thoughts. We can meditate by thinking about a Scripture story, art, and music.
<b>MESSIAH</b>	A messiah is a person chosen to save people from a particular fate. The word means savior? Jesus Christ is our Messiah, chosen by God to free us from sin and death.
<b>MINISTRY</b>	A ministry is a way of serving and caring for others in Christ's name.
<b>MORAL VIRTUES</b>	The moral virtues are four spiritual qualities-temperance, prudence, justice, and fortitude-that help us avoid sin.
<b>ORIGINAL SIN</b>	Original sin is the sin of the first man and woman, passed on to all human beings. Because of it, we are weakened in our ability to resist sin and do good.
<b>PASCHAL MYSTERY</b>	The Paschal Mystery is the way that Jesus' Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension saved us from sin and gave us life after death.
<b>PASSOVER</b>	Passover is the Jewish celebration of the Israelites' exodus from Egypt.
<b>Patriarch</b>	A patriarch, a term meaning "father," is a great leader of the Hebrews from early Scripture times. A patriarch is also the male leader of a family or clan.
<b>PERSISTENCE</b>	Persistence is the act of continually pursuing something in spite of obstacles. Prayer often requires persistence.

<b>PHARISEES</b>	Pharisees were Jewish people who accepted both the written law of the Old Testament and spoken teachings and tradition.

<b>PURGATORY</b>	Purgatory is a final purification from sin after death.
<b>RESURRECTION</b>	Resurrection is the new life given to us when our bodies reunite with our souls at the end of time.
<b>REVELATION</b>	Revelation is God's act of revealing himself and inviting us to respond with faith.
<b>REVERENCE</b>	Reverence is honor and respect. We can show our reverence for God through our prayers.
<b>SACRAMENT</b>	A sacrament is a sacred sign and cause of grace instituted by Christ in the Church to continue the saving action of Christ through the Holy Spirit.
<b>SACRAMENTAL</b>	A sacramental is a symbolic prayer, blessing, object, or action instituted by the Church that can lead us to a fuller participation in the grace of the sacraments.
<b>SACRAMENTAL GRACE</b>	Sacramental grace is the unique gift of God's love that we receive in each sacrament.
<b>SACRIFICE</b>	A sacrifice is an act of unselfish giving. It is also a ritual offering made to God by a priest on behalf of the people.
<b>SADDUCEES</b>	Sadducees were Jewish people who accepted only the written law of the Old Testament and rejected spoken teachings and tradition.
<b>SALVATION</b>	Salvation is freedom from the pain of sin.

<b>ABBA</b>	<i>Abba</i> is the word that Jesus used to teach people to call God "Father" in prayer. The word meant "Daddy" to the Jewish people.

<b>ADVOCATE</b>	The Advocate is another name for the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Trinity, who helps and guides us in following Jesus.
<b>ALMSGIVING</b>	Almsgiving is the act of giving time, money, or goods to people who are poor or in need.
<b>ASCENSION</b>	The Ascension was the moment when Jesus, in his resurrected body, returned to his Father in heaven. He will come again at the end of time.
<b>BAPTISMAL GRACE</b>	Baptismal grace is the gift of sharing in God's divine life that we receive at Baptism, which frees us from sin.
<b>BAPTISMAL VOWS</b>	Promises made at Baptism to reject sin and to live as children of God.
<b>BEATITUDES</b>	The Beatitudes are Jesus' teachings about how to live and find real happiness in God's kingdom. They teach us to love God, love each other, seek justice, and spread peace.
<b>BLASPHEMY</b>	Blasphemy is the act of showing contempt for God or sacred things through one's words or actions.
<b>CANDIDATE</b>	A candidate is a person who pursues and prepares for a certain role. A person who is preparing to receive the sacrament of Confirmation is called a candidate.
<b>CATHOLIC</b>	The word <i>catholic</i> means "universal." With a capital C, it describes the Church founded by Christ's apostles. Because it welcomes all people who believe in Jesus Christ, the Catholic Church is universal.
<b>CATHOLIC EPISTLES</b>	The Catholic epistles were letters written to the universal Church. These seven letters are included in the New Testament.
<b>CHARISM</b>	A charism is a talent or gift from the Holy Spirit that an individual uses to serve the Church, live a Christian life, and work for the good of all people
<b>CHASTITY</b>	Chastity is a virtue that helps us express our sexuality in a mature and unselfish manner. The word chastity describes a state of being morally pure in thought and conduct.

<b>CHRISM</b>	Chrism is the perfumed oil that has been blessed by a bishop and is used for anointing in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. Being anointed with chrism is a sign of receiving the Holy Spirit.
<b>COMMISSIONED</b>	To be commissioned is to be entrusted with the power to fulfill a particular task. Christ entrusted the apostles and their successors with the task of leading and serving the Church.
<b>COMMUNION OF SAINTS</b>	The Communion of Saints is the union of all those, both living and dead, who believe in Christ.
<b>CONFIRMATION</b>	Confirmation is a sacrament of initiation in which we receive the special strength of the Holy Spirit and become full members of the Church.
<b>CONSCIENCE</b>	A conscience is an ability to know what is right and what is wrong.
<b>CONSECRATE</b>	To consecrate is to make sacred. The priest calls upon the Holy Spirit to consecrate the bread and wine, or change them into the Body and Blood of Christ.
<b>CONTEMPLATION</b>	Contemplation is prayer without the need for images, words, or thoughts; it is resting in God's presence.
<b>COVET</b>	To covet means to have an excessive desire for what rightfully belongs to someone else.
<b>DIOCESE</b>	A diocese is a region or district whose parishes a bishop serves and oversees.
<b>DISCIPLE</b>	A disciple is a follower of Christ who carries on Christ's mission by showing others the love of God.
<b>EASTER TRIDUUM</b>	The Easter Triduum is the holiest celebration of the liturgical year. It begins on Holy Thursday evening and concludes with the evening prayer on Easter Sunday. The Triduum includes the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday, and the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection at the Easter Vigil.
<b>EPISTLE</b>	An epistle is a letter written to a Christian community by Saint Paul or another disciple in the early Church. Such letters are included in the New Testament.)
<b>EVANGELIST</b>	An evangelist is a person who proclaims God to the world by word of mouth, through writings, or as a living example. The word also refers to a writer of a Gospel. Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John are often called the four evangelists.

<b>EVANGELIZE</b>	To evangelize is to spread the truth of the Gospels through our words and love of others.

<b>GRACE</b>	Grace, a gift that God freely gives us, is God's life within us, which fills us with love and enables us to live according to God's will.
<b>HALLOW</b>	To hallow is to venerate, honor, or treat as holy.
<b>HOLY OIL</b>	Holy oil is oil blessed by the bishop and used in the Anointing of the Sick and other sacraments.
<b>HOLY WEEK</b>	Holy Week is the week that begins on Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. It includes the final days of Lent, as well as Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. During this week, we remember in a special way the events that are at the center of our lives as Christians: the Passion, death, and Resurrection of Christ.
<b>INCARNATION</b>	The Incarnation is God's Son becoming man, one like us, Jesus Christ, who is both human and divine.
<b>INDOMITABLE</b>	<i>Indomitable</i> means "unable to be conquered."
<b>INDULGENCE</b>	An indulgence is the removal of all or some of the punishments that we must suffer in purgatory for the effects of our sins on earth.
<b>INTERCESSION</b>	An intercession is a prayer that we say on behalf of others in need of God's help.

<b>JUSTICE</b>	Justice, a moral virtue, is the practice of treating others fairly.

<b>MAGISTERIUM</b>	The pope, in communion with the bishops, is the teaching authority, or Magisterium, of the Church.
<b>MEDITATION</b>	Meditation is a type of prayer in which we are silent and concentrate on listening to God through our feelings, imagination, and thoughts. Meditation is thinking about God's presence in our lives.
<b>MESSIAH</b>	<i>Messiah</i> means "God's anointed one" or "savior." A messiah is a person chosen to save people from a particular fate. Jesus is the Messiah, the One promised to deliver all people from sin.
<b>MIRACLE</b>	A miracle is a wondrous sign or event that can only have happened through the power of God.
<b>MISSIONER</b>	A missionary is a person who shares his or her faith through preaching and charitable works. Missioners of the Church preach Christ's message of salvation to all people.
<b>MONSTRANCE</b>	A monstrance is a special container in which the Eucharist is placed for adoration.
<b>MORALITY</b>	Morality is a system of rules for good conduct based on our beliefs. Christian morality includes keeping the commandments in response to God's love.
<b>MORAL VIRTUES</b>	The moral virtues are four spiritual qualities--temperance, prudence, justice, and fortitude-- that we receive through the Holy Spirit. They help us avoid sin.

<b>MORTAL SIN</b>	A mortal sin is a serious act against God's law, done purposely. It separates us from God's grace. It normally requires the sacrament of Reconciliation to be forgiven.
<b>MOSAIC LAW</b>	The Mosaic Law, or Law of Moses, sets forth rules and practices that Jewish people have followed from the time of Moses, for whom the Law is named. The Ten Commandments, the basis of Mosaic Law, are found in the Bible, in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5:6--21. The Book of Leviticus contains further details of the Law.
<b>NOVENA</b>	A novena is a Catholic devotion in which specific prayers are said on nine consecutive days.
<b>ORAL TRADITION</b>	Oral tradition is a body of stories that has been passed down by word of mouth. In ancient Israel, before the Gospels were written, people told stories about God and all God did for them.
<b>ORIGINAL SIN</b>	Original sin is the sin of the first man and woman, which has been passed on to all human beings. Because of it, we are weakened in our ability to resist sin and do good.
<b>PAPAL INFALLIBILITY</b>	Papal infallibility is the doctrine that when the pope speaks officially for the Church on a matter of faith or morals, he is guided by the Holy Spirit and what he says is free from error.
<b>PARABLE</b>	A parable is a story that teaches a moral or religious lesson. Parables often use everyday events and objects to explain important truths.
<b>PARTICULAR JUDGMENT</b>	At the end of our lives, Jesus Christ judges how well we have followed him. Particular judgment is the judgment each individual receives from Christ at his or her death.
<b>PASCHAL MYSTERY</b>	The Paschal mystery is God's plan for our salvation through the Passion, death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus. The Church celebrates the Paschal mystery in the liturgy throughout the year, but in a special way during the Easter Triduum.
<b>PASSION</b>	Jesus' Passion is the suffering, crucifixion, and death he endured for our sins.
<b>PENANCE</b>	Penance is another name for the sacrament of Reconciliation. With a lowercase p, it refers to a prayer or kind act that we do as an expression of sorrow for our sins.
<b>PENTECOST</b>	Pentecost is the day on which Jesus Christ's disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit, which empowered them to proclaim the good news. Pentecost is often referred to as "the day the Church was born."

<b>PERJURY</b>	Perjury is the act of lying after having made an oath to tell the truth, with God as one's witness.

<b>POLYGAMY</b>	Polygamy is the state of having several marriage partners at the same time.
<b>PREFERENTIAL OPTION FOR THE POOR</b>	The preferential option for the poor is an understanding that we must give priority to the needs of the poor and vulnerable in society.
<b>PRESBYTER</b>	In the Church today, the term presbyter means "priest." In the early Church, presbyters were the appointed religious leaders, or elders, of the early Christian communities.
<b>PRUDENCE</b>	Prudence, a moral virtue, is the habit of making good judgments and decisions.
<b>PURGATORY</b>	Purgatory is a final purification from sin after death.
<b>RESURRECTION</b>	The Resurrection is Jesus' victory over death as he rose to new life. On the last day there will be a resurrection of our bodies as we rise to new life with Christ.
<b>REVELATION</b>	Revelation is God's act of revealing God's own self and inviting us to respond with faith. A revelation is also an important truth about God, expressed under the inspiration and guidance of the Holy Spirit.
<b>RITE OF ELECTION</b>	A ritual that takes place on the first Sunday of Lent, in which godparents or sponsors testify on behalf of the readiness of catechumens to be admitted into the Church.
<b>SACRAMENTAL</b>	A sacramental is a symbolic prayer, blessing, object, or action instituted by the Church that can lead us to a fuller participation in the grace of the sacraments.

<b>SACRED SCRIPTURES</b>	The term Sacred Scriptures refers to the Old and New Testaments of the Bible, which have been accepted by the Catholic Church as the word of God written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.
<b>SALVATION</b>	Salvation is freedom from the pain of sin and assurance of permanent union with God.
<b>SANCTIFICATION</b>	Sanctification is the act of making or of being made holy.
<b>SOLIDARITY</b>	Solidarity is the unity we share with all our brothers and sisters, who are made in the image of God.
<b>TEMPERANCE</b>	Temperance, a moral virtue, is the habit of living in moderation and controlling our desires.
<b>TEMPTATION</b>	Temptation is an enticement or a pressure to turn away from God through sinful thoughts, words, or actions.
<b>THEOLOGICAL VIRTUES</b>	The theological virtues are three spiritual qualities--faith, hope, and charity--that come from God and help us become more holy.
<b>TRADITION</b>	Tradition is the body of official teachings, rituals, customs, and practices of the Church that have developed under the guidance of the Holy Spirit and are handed down from the apostles.
<b>TRESPASS</b>	<i>Trespass</i> means "to commit a sin."
<b>TRINITY</b>	The Trinity is the three Persons of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We believe that there is only one God, who is revealed to us in these three divine Persons.
<b>VENIAL SIN</b>	A venial sin is less serious than a mortal sin. Venial sins weaken our relationship with God and the church community.
<b>VIATICUM</b>	<i>Viaticum</i> , which means "provision for the journey" in Latin, is Holy Communion that is given to a dying person.
<b>VIRTUE</b>	A virtue is an ability to make morally good decisions that lead to the habit of doing good. Christian virtues are considered gifts from God that we can develop into habits of Christian living.
<b>WAR CRIMES</b>	War crimes are acts of violence against innocent people during wartime.
<b>WITNESS</b>	Witness is an attesting to the truth of something by words or actions. We give witness to Christ by imitating in our everyday lives what Jesus would say or do.

<b>AGE OF REASON</b>	The age of reason is the age at which children are able to distinguish between right and wrong, approximately age seven.

<b>ALMS</b>	Alms are donations of time, money, or goods to the poor.
<b>APOCALYPSE</b>	The Apocalypse, or Book of Revelation, is the last book of the Bible. It describes the end of the world in symbolic language.
<b>APOSTOLIC</b>	The Catholic Church is apostolic because it is founded on and faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ and the apostles.
<b>BEATIFIC VISION</b>	The beatific vision is the sight of God, which brings everlasting happiness and peace.
<b>BEATITUDE</b>	<i>Beatitude</i> is another word for blessedness or happiness. A beatitude is also any one of the eight guidelines about how to live and find real happiness in God's kingdom that Jesus taught in the Sermon on the Mount.
<b>BLASPHEMY</b>	Blasphemy is the act of showing contempt for God or sacred things through one's words or actions.
<b>CANON LAW</b>	Canon law is the collection of the laws of the Catholic Church.
<b>CATECHESIS</b>	Catechesis is a process of faith formation that includes education and participation in the life of the Catholic community.
<b>CATHOLIC</b>	The word <i>catholic</i> means "universal." With a capital C, it describes the Church founded by Christ's apostles. Because it welcomes all people who believe in Jesus Christ, the Catholic Church is universal.
<b>CHRISTENDOM</b>	Christendom is the name given to a part of the world in which Christianity dominates. Europe, in which the Church and the state formed one society for about 1,000 years, was once known as Christendom.
<b>CHURCH</b>	The Church is the living Body of Christ, the People of God. The Catholic Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic. The word <i>Church</i> means "convocation," or gathering together.

<b>CHURCH FATHERS</b>	The early Christian leaders whose teachings helped develop Christian doctrine are known as Church Fathers.
<b>CONVERSION</b>	From a Latin word meaning "to turn around," <i>conversion</i> means "a turning away from sin."
<b>COUNTER-REFORMATION</b>	The Counter-Reformation was the sixteenth-century movement of reform instituted by the Catholic Church to reverse the effects of earlier reforms and to counter the increasing strength of Protestantism.
<b>COVET</b>	To covet means to have an excessive desire for what rightfully belongs to someone else.
<b>CRUSADES</b>	The Crusades were military attempts by Christians to free the Holy Land from Muslim control.
<b>DENOMINATION</b>	A denomination is an individual, organized religious body that is a form of a particular faith. Reformed Christian churches, such as the Lutheran Church, are Protestant denominations.
<b>DEVOTION</b>	A devotion is a special way of praying to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit, or of expressing love for Mary and the saints.
<b>DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH</b>	"Doctor of the Church" is a title that the Church gives to saints whose writings have greatly helped others understand matters of faith or doctrine.
<b>DOCTRINE</b>	<i>Doctrine</i> refers to an official teaching or a body of official teachings of the Church.
<b>ECUMENICAL COUNCIL</b>	An ecumenical council is a worldwide gathering of the pope and all the bishops. Ecumenical councils help clarify church teachings.
<b>ECUMENISM</b>	Ecumenism is the movement to establish unity among Christian churches.
<b>ENCYCLICAL</b>	An encyclical is a letter from the pope to all the members of the Church throughout the world in which the pope clarifies or reinforces Catholic teachings.
<b>EPISCOPAL</b>	The word <i>Episcopal</i> is used to describe bishops or the objects, actions, and events in their ministry.

<b>EUCHARIST</b>	In the sacrament of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The Eucharist is the central sacrament of the Church. It is the heart of Catholic worship.
<b>EX NIHILO</b>	<i>Ex nihilo</i> is a Latin phrase meaning "from nothing." It is used to describe how God created the universe.
<b>FAITH</b>	<i>Faith</i> is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen (based on Hebrews 11:1). It means believing and trusting in God.
<b>FIAT</b>	<i>Fiat</i> is a Latin word meaning "Let it happen" or "Let it be done."
<b>FREE WILL</b>	Free will is the freedom to choose to do what is right or what is wrong.
<b>GRACE</b>	Grace, a gift that God freely gives us, is God's life within us, which fills us with love and enables us to do God's will.
<b>HALLOW</b>	To hallow is to venerate, honor, or treat as holy.
<b>HEAVEN</b>	Heaven is everlasting happiness with God, and with all people who love God and others, after death.
<b>HELL</b>	Hell is everlasting suffering and separation from God, and from all people who love God and others, after death.
<b>HERESY</b>	A heresy is a denial of a church doctrine.
<b>ICON</b>	An icon is a holy image of Jesus, the Virgin Mary, or the saints, often made out of gold leaf and other special materials. Icons are an important part of spirituality for Christians in Eastern churches.
<b>INDULGENCE</b>	An indulgence is the removal of all or some of the punishments that we must suffer in purgatory for the effects of our sins on earth.
<b>LATIN</b>	Latin was the common language spoken in the Roman Empire. It is the basis for many European languages.
<b>LITURGY</b>	The liturgy is the official, public worship of the Church. It includes the celebration of Mass and the sacraments.
<b>LITURGY OF THE HOURS</b>	The Liturgy of the Hours is the Church's official prayer for certain times of the day and night. It is also called the <i>Divine Office</i> . It consists of psalms, readings, hymns, and prayers.

<b>MAGISTERIUM</b>	The pope, in communion with the bishops, is the teaching authority, or Magisterium, of the Church.
<b>MARKS OF THE CHURCH</b>	The marks of the Church are the four qualities of the Catholic Church that distinguish it as the true Church established by Christ to bring salvation to humankind: one, holy, catholic, and apostolic. The Church is one because it is united in faith, worship, and authority; holy because it is in communion with God; catholic because it is universal; and apostolic because it is founded on and faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ and the apostles.
<b>MASS</b>	Mass is another name for the celebration of the sacrament of the Eucharist. It is taken from the Latin word <i>missa</i> , meaning "sent," which was once used at the end of the celebration.
<b>MENDICANT ORDER</b>	A mendicant order is a religious community of men or women who consider themselves totally dependent on God. Members of these orders support themselves by begging and asking for charity.
<b>MONASTERY</b>	A monastery is a lifelong residence for monks or nuns. The word <i>monastery</i> may also refer to the community of monks or nuns at such a residence.
<b>MOSAIC LAW</b>	The Mosaic Law, or Law of Moses, sets forth rules and practices that the Jewish people have followed since the time of Moses, for whom the Law is named. The Ten Commandments, the basis of Mosaic Law, are found in the Bible, in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5:6—21. The Book of Leviticus contains further details of the Law.
<b>NATURAL LAW</b>	The natural law, which is part of human nature and lasts forever, allows people to know the difference between good and evil.
<b>NOVENA</b>	A novena is a Catholic devotion in which specific prayers are said on nine consecutive days.
<b>PAPAL INFALLIBILITY</b>	Papal infallibility is the doctrine that when the pope speaks officially for the Church on a matter of faith or morals, he is guided by the Holy Spirit and what he says is free from error.
<b>PASCHAL MYSTERY</b>	The Paschal mystery is God's plan for our salvation through the Passion, death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus.
<b>PASTORAL</b>	<i>Pastor</i> is the Latin word for "shepherd." <i>Pastoral</i> describes the work of priests or bishops in "shepherding," or guiding, people in the church community.

<b>PASTORAL LETTER</b>	A pastoral letter is a message from a bishop or bishops giving guidance to the members of the Church or society.
<b>PENTATEUCH</b>	The Pentateuch is the first book of the Old Testament.
<b>PERJURY</b>	Perjury is the act of lying after having made an oath to tell the truth, with God as one's witness.
<b>PIETY</b>	Piety is an attitude of dedication to and reverence for God and holy things.
<b>PILGRIMAGE</b>	A pilgrimage is a journey to a holy place or sacred site for spiritual or devotional reasons.
<b>PLAGIARISM</b>	Plagiarism is the use of someone's ideas or works as if they were one's own.
<b>PREDESTINATION</b>	Predestination is the doctrine that God determines whether our souls are saved or damned before we are born.
<b>PRESBYTERS</b>	Presbyters were the appointed religious leaders, or elders, of the early Christian communities. In the Church today, the term <i>presbyter</i> means "priest."
<b>PRESIDER</b>	A presider is a priest who leads a sacramental or liturgical celebration as well as consecrates the bread and wine during Mass.
<b>PROTESTANT REFORMATION</b>	The Protestant Reformation was the early sixteenth-century religious movement begun in Europe by Martin Luther that set out to reform some of the doctrines and practices of the Catholic Church. The efforts of Luther and other reformers resulted in the development of Protestantism.
<b>PURGATORY</b>	Purgatory is a final purification from sin after death.
<b>RECONCILIATION</b>	Reconciliation is a sacrament of healing in which Catholics ask forgiveness for sin and reunite with God and with the church community.
<b>REFORMATION</b>	Reformation is the act of removing faults or abuses.
<b>RITUAL</b>	A ritual is a formal ceremony that has a set of rules. The Eucharistic celebration is a ritual of the Catholic Church.
<b>SACRAMENT</b>	A sacrament is a sacred sign and cause of grace instituted by Christ in the Church to continue the saving action of God through the Holy Spirit.

<b>SACRAMENTAL LIFE</b>	The sacramental life of the Church is the way in which the Church celebrates the liturgy and the seven sacraments. Through the Church's sacramental life, we are united with Christ.
<b>SACRIFICIAL MEAL</b>	The term <i>sacrificial meal</i> describes the Mass, which is both a holy sacrifice and a sacred meal.
<b>SANCTIFYING GRACE</b>	Sanctifying grace is grace that heals us of sin and makes us Christlike. We receive sanctifying grace first at Baptism. It works within us throughout our lives to make us holy.
<b>SOCIAL JUSTICE</b>	Social justice is respect for human dignity demonstrated through actions that promote human rights.
<b>SOLIDARITY</b>	Solidarity is the unity we share with all our brothers and sisters, who are made in the image of God.
<b>STEWARDSHIP</b>	Stewardship is responsibility for caring for and protecting the well-being of another person, group, or entity.
<b>THEOTOKOS</b>	<i>Theotokos</i> is a Greek word meaning "God-bearer." The early Church used this word to express the belief that Mary is truly the Mother of God.
<b>TRANSUBSTANTIATION</b>	Transubstantiation is the sacred mystery in which bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ.
<b>TRESPASS</b>	<i>Trespass</i> means "to commit a sin."
<b>TRINITARIAN</b>	Trinitarian means "reflecting the unity of the Blessed Trinity." The Church is Trinitarian because it reflects the unity of the Trinity by being the People of God, the Body of Christ, and the Temple of the Holy Spirit.
<b>UNITY</b>	<i>Unity</i> means "acting as one." The members of the Body of Christ, the Church, are unified. We pray for Christian unity.
<b>VERNACULAR</b>	The vernacular is the language that is native to a region or country.
<b>VIRTUE</b>	A virtue is an ability to make morally good decisions that lead to the habit of doing good. Christian virtues are considered gifts from God that we can develop into habits of Christian living.
<b>YAHWEH</b>	<i>Yahweh</i> is a Hebrew word meaning "I am who I am." In the Old Testament, Yahweh is God's sacred name, which God revealed to Moses.
